They Hate What They Can't Have or Understand

- The peons of the Collective have been whipped into a frenzy through the lies of Rath Oligard and his band of "yes men". The leaders of the Collective are jealous of the power of the Force harnessed by the Brotherhood and live by the belief that if they can't have it, no one can.
- Because of the lies spread about the true nature of the Force, the average member of the Collective is taught to fear what they don't understand.
- This fear drives them to kill every last Force User and they will not stop until they've either done that or we stop them
