

# RANCOR RAMPAGE!!!

Rancor Rampage is an exciting new ride, located in the animal and safari-themed section of the park. As patrons entered, the line carries them through a carefully maintained jungle landscape, miniature waterfalls, animatronic birds, and fog machines to give the place an eerie, foreboding air. As the line progresses, the guests enter into what seems to be a remote research outpost, damaged and showing signs of a rancor attack. The ride itself takes place on a simulated canoe, which is attached to a track beneath the water. Plants press in close on either side of the ride to hide the mechanics, and the animatronics of various animals spread around. Crew and Entertainers are dressed as hunters and research personnel, looking nervous and on-edge.

Each guest is presented with a light-gun, built to resemble a blaster, and informed by an announcer that a man-eating rancor has been spotted in these woods. Last night, the research post was attacked, and they've been sent in to deal with the beast. The guests are instructed to shoot the rancor if they see it, and any other dangerous beasts that threaten them. In particular, they are advised to aim for the rancors eyes. Guests are awarded points for their aim on a small screen in the canoe.

The first few minutes of the ride are quiet and tension building, with nothing but a few loud animal noises to cause tension. As the boat progresses it nears a simulated waterfall, causing the announcer to panic. and slowly spins in place on the track until facing away from the waterfall in order to escape it. At this moment the animatronic rancor attacks, jostling the boat and frightening the guests, before their sent headlong and backwards down the "waterfall" track behind them. There's a small splash of water at the end, and the canoe enters an area of simulated white-water, with the Rancor chasing them and appearing along the river's banks every now and then. Gundarks swing overhead, which the guests can also shoot for extra points. At the end of the white water there is a moment of calm, until guests turn a corner to find the Rancor waiting in the river up-ahead posed to eat them. The guests shoot the rancor, and with a final roar it falls into the water with a splash, allowing the guest's canoe to continue safely and back to the station, ending the ride.
